The Netherlands

Measles: in table 2 and in table 14 is reported that The Netherlands have not recommendation for measles in adult. Instead MMR vaccine is recommended in adult (born since 1965) that not had measles and that are at risk for profession or travel.

"Measles vaccination (MMR vaccine) should be offered to non-vaccinated persons, born since 1965, who have not had measles and who have a risk to acquire infection because of their profession, such as personnel in hospitals and on aircrafts. >Measles vaccination (MMR vaccine) should be offered to non-vaccinated persons born since 1965, who have not had measles and who travel to measles endemic areas."

Spain

Mumps: in table 2 and in table 16 is reported that Spain have not recommendation for mumps in adult.

Instead the last official recommendation for Spain by the Ministry of Health about adult vaccination recommend measles, rubella and mumps vaccine for adults (page 53/113): *"Offer and recommend a dose of MMR to adults unvaccinated or without prior documented history of disease and have no medical contraindication"*
